The meal, catered again this year by Enos Farms, offers a choice roast leg of lamb, roast chicken, or baked tofu all served with steamed broccoli, potatoes gratin, house made bread and butter, coffee, tea, and lemonade. Each person should bring **his or her own table service (plate, flatware, cup)** to use at the meal. Napkins will be provided.

For everyone's amusement there will be a trivia quiz with small prizes available. Those who attend should brush up on their knowledge of Cymraeg, Welsh sports, Welsh history, etc. After lunch there will be folk singing presented and led by Danny Proud and singing and recitation by Robert Humphries.

Welsh Weekend May 2-4, 2014, in Portage, WI



Wythfed Penwythnos i Bawb (*Eighth Welsh Weekend for Everyone*) will be held in nearby Portage, WI, this year. From the pub night beginning at 5:00 p.m. at *Corner Pocket Bar and Grill* on Friday evening, May 2, to the te bach following the 82nd annual State Gymanfa Ganu on Sunday afternoon at First Presbyterian Church, May 4, the weekend promises fun, food, and festivities for everyone.

At the Friday pub night event, participants will enjoy supper and singing. Those in town Saturday morning will be provided with information about interesting sights to see in Portage and places to have lunch before going to **Portage Presbyterian Church**, 120 West Pleasant St., at 12:30 p.m. to sign in for an afternoon of workshops, displays, and te bach. Afternoon workshops will range from the *Ysgol Gân* (singing school) led by Trefor Williams, who will also be serving as director of the gymanfa ganu on Sunday, to a workshop on rugby led by Elfryn Thomas as well as offerings in learning Cymraeg, genealogy, and other popular topics. Following a supper catered by a group at the church (proceeds to help support their missionary projects), participants will enjoy a lively noson lawen and chairing of the bard, the winner of the weekend Eisteddfod competition. There will be activities especially for children. Participants bringing a t-shirt, sweatshirt, tote bag, etc. can have the weekend logo (shown above) printed. The gymanfa ganu will also be held at Portage Presbyterin Church beginning at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 4.

Cymdeithas Madog is pleased to announce its 38th annual Cwrs Cymraeg Welsh language week. So set your sights on Ontario's Garden City -- St. Catharines -- July 20-27, 2014. Join old friends and make new ones in our week long Welsh Course for beginners and accomplished users of the language alike. We will also hold cultural activities in the evenings such as folk dancing, a quiz and pub sing-a-long, a Welsh film, and a talent night or the famous Welsh "noson lawen" and Eisteddfod. An optional course trip at mid-week will take us to surrounding sites of interest. We hope you will join us.

Cwrs Cymraeg (which simply means "Welsh Course") emphasizes the spoken language, with classroom instruction at various levels ranging from absolute beginners to quite advanced. The teaching staff of experienced Welsh-speaking instructors is brought from Wales and North America. There are approximately 5 hours of language class each day, supplemented by further language and culture-related activities in the afternoon. Evening events such as singing, folk dancing, Welsh-language films, and a Noson Lawen (talent night) provide additional opportunities to relax while enjoying a Welsh-language atmosphere.
